PARTNERSHIP AND COMMUNITY SAFETY PROGRAMMES

The following applications have been received from the Constabulary and/or partners for funding for a number of projects that support the Commissioner's priorities and tackle issues that have a high level of impact on the constabulary.

PROJECT / INITIATIVE NAME:	WHITE RIBBON SPORTS CAMPAIGN		
TOTAL COST:	£10,000.00	PRIORITY:	Vulnerable People Domestic Abuse
AMOUNT REQUESTED:	£10,000.00	Match Funds:	Organisations own resources
Summary:	The Sports Programme works with local Sports Clubs, players and coaches to adopt the white ribbon sports award programme and for individuals to become white ribbon Ambassadors. For example - during August 2014, the Nottingham v Leicester Rugby match 500 new men signed the white ribbon pledge, and the same club has players going into schools with local Domestic Abuse specialists to talk about healthy relationships. White Ribbon staff will contact sports clubs, starting with Football and Rugby clubs and work with regional sports associations, who have also been supportive. Because the White Ribbon Award is reviewable every two years, we will create a culture, not of one-off events, but a permanent commitment to work around the issues.		
Comments:	As the OPCC is working towards White Ribbon status support for this would be a key part of this programme.

Summary:	"Alternative Solutions to Hate Crime Conference" took place in November in Burnley to focus on the issues relating to hate crime on alternative subcultures.		
Comments:	The Commissioner has agreed to fund the event, with the final figure being agreed once all costs and income have been accounted

Summary:	Street Pastors provide key support to the policing of the night time economy in Preston city centre and have proved to be a valuable volunteer resource. To end of October they provided 1566 hours of street work, assisted 3166 people and intervened on 31 occasions where incidents could have become serious		
Comments:	The Commissioner provided £6000 funding in 2013-14.		
Proposed Funding Stream:	Community Safety Funding 2014		
Recommendation:	1. That this Agreement is supported by the Commissioner 2. That funding of £6,000 is allocated towards the cost of providing the Street Pastor volunteers in the Preston area.

TOTAL COST:	£3,850.00	PRIORITY:	Tackling ASB & Crime Restorative Justice
AMOUNT REQUESTED:	£3,014.00	Match Funds:	Fylde CSP £836.00
Summary:	The Writing Wrongs Programme is tailored to young people using restorative approaches and practices to raise awareness and understanding of the impact of ASB and crime on the individual and wider community.		
Comments:	This programme supports the Commissioners approach to develop the use of restorative approaches to tackling crime and ASB.

PROJECT / INITIATIVE NAME:	LANCASHIRE SPORT PARTNERSHIP / RED ROSE RECOVERY CHALLENGE THROUGH SPORT INITIATIVE		
TOTAL COST:	£30,000.00	PRIORITY:	Victims Vulnerable People
AMOUNT REQUESTED:	£10,000.00	Match Funds:	Public Health - £20,000
Summary:	The initiative uses a peer-led sports programme to provide support and development for recovering substance mis-users to improve lifestyle and reduce the risk of them re-offending. The initial pilot in four locations across Lancashire has engaged 155 participants and 4 Support Workers from within the recovery community.		
Comments:	The funding is sought as short term funding for a 6 month period pending a substantial funding bid from Reaching Communities and Sport England. A 3 year match fund of £26,700 per year will also be sought from a range of partners, including the PCC.		
Proposed Funding Stream:	Community Safety Funding 2014		
Recommendation:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. That this Agreement is supported by the Commissioner 2. That funding of £10,000 is allocated to fund this project to match the funding from Public Health of £20,000.
