Summary:	<p>Transform a 3 day training programme for young people on knife crime into a 1 day programme to be delivered in four high schools in the most deprived wards in Preston. Topics covered include recognising the role of bullying in gang culture, the effects of knife crime on others, anger management and improving relationships with the Police.</p> <p>The programme also aims to train 10 young volunteers to deliver the programme in the future.</p>		
Comments:	<p>The project is being developed in partnership with PC Rutledge and would provide a very useful resource to tackle gang related issues in the Preston area.</p> <p>The training element will enable the programme to be run beyond the period of time supported by this funding</p>
