<b>AREA:</b>	Preston	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Tackle crime, ASB & Re-offending
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£1,700	<b>Match Funds:</b>	Organisations own resources
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	Positive Activities Programme £2,200		
<b>Summary:</b>	Callon Kids Community Club will run a Positive Activities Programme over 4 weeks in the school summer holidays (3 days a week). The activities programme is aimed at children within Callon, Fishwick and St Matthews, who are among the most disadvantaged and socially excluded.		
<b>Comments:</b>	Callon Kids Community Club was awarded funding from the Community Action Fund in July 2014 therefore; the money will only be released on the 1 <sup>st</sup> July to comply with the conditions of the criteria.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner</li> <li>2. That a grant of <b>£1,700</b> is provided to Callon Kids Community Club equating to <b>77%</b> of the funding for the full project.</li> </ol>

<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£1,760	<b>Match Funds:</b>	Organisations own resources
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	TooManyCooks £2,400		
<b>Summary:</b>	This is a literacy intervention that works with groups, particularly young people at risk of offending. The book 'camp' will last one week (full-time) and during this week, young people will create a novel. On the Friday afternoon their novel will be published and they will receive printed copies of their books several days later.		
<b>Comments:</b>	eQuality Time have been working with West Lancs CVS who put them in contact with both groups of young people at risk of offending and with adults with substance abuse issues.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner 2. That a grant of <b>£1,760</b> is provided to eQuality Time.

<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	Eastpines Park Blackpool Football Kicks Programme £6,000		
<b>Summary:</b>	Free football training sessions in Eastpines Park on a Monday and Friday night (for 12 months) for young people (aged 7-19yrs) from Bispham, Norbreck, Anchorholme and Cleveleys.		
<b>Comments:</b>	Friends of Eastpines Park secured a grant from the Sandhurst Area Forum to run this project. However, the grant runs out at the end of July and they wish secure the CAF grant and Blackpool Council Grant in order to keep running these sessions		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner 2. That a grant of <b>£2,000</b> is provided to Friends of Eastpines Park, representing a third of the total cost of the project.

<b>Summary:</b>	To purchase a mower and strimmer for Mill Hill Community Football Club to allow them to carry on running their football teams.		
<b>Comments:</b>	The Commissioner has previously supported Mill Hill Community Football Club in the purchase of other equipment to enable them to maintain the facilities for the community in this area of high deprivation in Blackburn.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner 2. That a grant of <b>£500</b> is provided to Mill Hill Community Football Club.

<b>AREA:</b>	Preston & Kirkham & Ashton Gardens, St Annes.	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Tackle Crime, Re-offending and ASB

<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	New Opportunity Festival £3,000		
<b>Summary:</b>	The Positive Opportunity Foundation has developed a stimulating multi sports project, for young people ages 12 – 18, 4 days a week, to run for a 5 week period.		
<b>Comments:</b>	It is suggested that we only provide half of the funding requested (£1,000) to The Sports Opportunity Foundation for them to deliver the New Opportunity Festival in the Preston area only as the Commissioner has already provided a lot of funding towards projects in the Kirkham and St Annes area.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner</li> <li>2. That a grant of <b>£1,000</b> is provided to the Sports Opportunity Foundation to fund the New Opportunity Festival within the Preston Area.</li> </ol>

<b>Summary:</b>	Free Multi-Sport activities for boys and girls aged between 10-17 years in the evening once per week at Springhill Primary School.		
<b>Comments:</b>	Sweeney's Multi-sports work with the Neighbourhood Policing Teams to target the most vulnerable young people and if members of the NPT attend during the evening sports session, it allows officers to engage with the young people within a relaxed environment.
