Project Name & Cost	Broadgate Mentoring and Coaching Family Project £3,658		
Summary:	Broadgate residents action group want to work with the top 10 most vulnerable and at risk young people for a 12 week period. Activities will include mentoring and coaching sessions, one to one counselling peer support activities, monthly parent and family support sessions and trips out of the area/sporting activities during the school holidays which will be earned through good behaviour.		
Comments:	The Commissioner awarded £1,500 to Broadgate Residents Action Group in April 2014.

Summary:	Eagles Wings aims to empower victims of domestic abuse by offering recovery based activities. They will run activity sessions twice a week, for 3 hours. Each session will hold 3 different activities. Activities include sewing, card making etc. Eagles Wings aims to provide support for women, helping them regain their confidence in a positive, private environment.		
Comments:	Eagles Wings plan to target their service users through partnership working with Safer Preston, Preston Women's Network, Lancashire Probation Trust etc. Eagles Wings are also in contact with Preston City Council to make plans for Eagles Wings to attend events, to help spread the word of the local group		
Recommendation:	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner 2. That a grant of £1,200 is provided to Eagles Wings.

Summary:	Lancashire Sports and Arts Foundation will deliver a range of stimulating and enriching activities, such as sports/physical as well as arts/cultural development activities during a 12 week programme to young people between 12-18 years.		
Comments:	Lancashire Sports and Arts Foundation have liaised with LCC Young Peoples Service has assisted into the development of this programme.

Summary:	Arts in the Park is a youth led music festival, which will take place on Saturday 28 th June in Lancaster. Larks in the Park Youth Committee wish to provide workshops to a number of young people. Workshops will be held by young people mentoring other youngsters.		
Comments:	The young people have been identified through partnership working with youth centres in areas of deprivation.		
Recommendation:	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner 2. That a grant of £1,960 is provided to Larks in the Park Youth Committee.

Summary:	Highfield youth project is a multi-sports community development programme which will work with young people aged 12-19 over a 10 week period (3 days a week) in some of Blackpool's most deprived local parks.		
Comments:	South Shore Cricket Club have informed their community safety partnership and it supports their local priority to reduce ASB and Re-offending as well as supporting the Commissioners priorities.

Summary:	Summer Fun for All wish to provide 2 days of open access activities such as Archery, high ropes, bouncy slide etc. to the young people of Darwen.		
Comments:	Summer Fun for All links in with other organisations, such as Reachout to connect with young people and hopefully offer them an opportunity to take part in as many activities as possible. The organisation also has two voluntary pupil well-being coordinators in local schools that link in the Local NPT regarding targeting vulnerable youngsters.
