Request for Funding from Preston City Council in support of the Prevent Agenda supporting the Muslim Community in respect of alienation and radicalisation of young people.

It is felt that whilst much attention has been directed towards the 'reporting side' of the prevent Strategy not much development and support has been directed towards the development of cross cultural links and the importance of harbouring dialogue and conversations

A request for £15k has been made to support these developments

'Appendix B

Building long term resilience of communities

A report has been received from Michelle Pilling Community Engagement and Safety Manager requesting funding to develop the dialogue in respect of the Prevent agenda and support.

There is growing concern over the alienation and radicalisation of many young people within our communities in the UK. The Prevent Strategy has been an important element in engaging public authorities in confronting this concern. However much attention has been directed at the "reporting" side of the Prevent Strategy and less on the development of cross-cultural links and the importance of dialogue and conversations. And yet this is probably the most important aspect of the strategy overall

It is recognised that the impact of the Prevent strategy is significantly reduced if communities do not play a key role in the development of preventative and community based solutions to neighbourhood issues that could create the conditions and environment for extremists to find a home. Over the years, the Council's capacity to carry out proactive community engagement activity has diminished due to budget cuts. There remains however, a number of long standing, well respected individuals and organisations within the community who have a range of experience.

Therefore, in order to complement and support the new duties laid down in the Counter Terrorism and Security Act, Preston City Council believes that engagement on Prevent with these key community organisations across the city will play an important role in building community resilience and countering extremist ideologies.

In order to support this work in Preston, we would request the sum of £15K from the OPCC. The details still need to be negotiated with partners but may include activities such as:

- Building capacity & supporting individuals within the Muslim community and within key community based agencies to enable them to be involved in targeted work to address extremism;
- Providing enabling support for events such as room hire/refreshments;
- Facilitator or training support for subjects such as e-safety / social media;
- Possible development & training of community ambassadors;
- Development & production of an awareness raising materials.

As requested, the attached is only a high level document and the detail would need to be developed, although if you need any further information then please feel free to give me a ring on Tuesday when I'm back in the office.

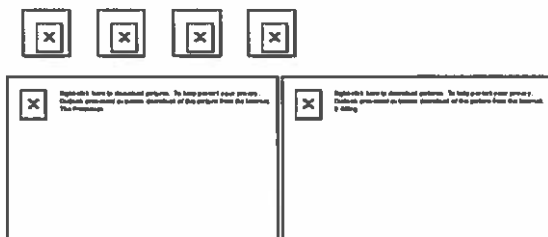

The following information is provided for your information:

1. The total number of units produced during the period was 10,000 units.

2. The total cost of production was \$100,000.

3. The cost per unit was \$10.00.
