In December 2015, the Police and Crime Commissioner allocated £600, 000 from the Proceeds of Crime Act reserve for the awarding of grants to public sector, community and voluntary organisations to deliver projects that contributed to the delivery of the priorities set out in the Police and Crime Plan. Following an extensive shortlisting process 18 awards were identified as successful.
