<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	Musical activity for the young £5,000		
<b>Summary:</b>	Blackpool Musical School work with vulnerable young people and offer them the opportunity to take up a new activity and learn new skills through one to one and group sessions over a 42 week music programme.		
<b>Comments:</b>	Blackpool Musical School work with the local police to identify young people who are at the risk of entering the criminal justice system.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner.</li> <li>2. That a grant of £3,000 is provided to Blackpool Musical School conditional they submit their constitution and accounts and meet the fund criteria.</li> <li>3. As the Police and Crime Commissioner has supported this project previously, Blackpool Musical School should look for other funding streams to support this project in the future.</li> </ol>

<b>Comments:</b>	Fishwick Milan work in partnership with the local policing team and Lancashire County Council Young Peoples Service with the aim to reduce anti-social behaviour through positive engagement with young people.

<b>AREA:</b>	South Ribble	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Tackle crime and reoffending

<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	Community Sport £3,510		
<b>Summary:</b>	Opportunity Sports Foundation will run a 50 week youth club at the local leisure centre for young people on a Friday evening. Offering young people the opportunity to take part in a range of sports whilst also targeting other youngsters through music.		
<b>Comments:</b>	Opportunity Sports Foundation worked with the local leisure centre to run a pilot project to reduce anti-social behaviour on the grounds. The pilot project allowed staff members to build relationships with the young people and a reduction in ASB was reported.

<b>Summary:</b>	Moor Nook Youth Development Scheme will run a 24 week multi sports programme for young people which will carry on delivering into the summer holiday period. Young people will have the opportunity to take part in Football, Dodgeball and Cricket.		
<b>Comments:</b>	The organisation has developed relationships with local services and will refer vulnerable youngsters on for support, for example, Young Addaction who provided a specialist drug and alcohol support service.

<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£1,880	<b>Match Funds:</b>	Blackpool 6 <sup>th</sup> Form, Blackpool Transport, Wyre Council, Fylde Council, local organisations and Volunteer support
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	International Women's Day Festival £9,515		
<b>Summary:</b>	The Washington Group will deliver sessions to approximately 450 young women in high schools across Blackpool, Fylde and Wyre. The Washington Group would like funding to support workshops that focus on online, personal and physical safety.		
<b>Comments:</b>	The Washington Group will work in partnership with a number of local organisation and both Fylde & Wyre Community Safety Partnerships support the event.

<b>Project Name Cost</b>	Adullam Programme £46,688		
<b>Details:</b>	The Adullam Programme helps reintegrate vulnerable people, in particularly those recently released from prison and substance misusers back into the community. The structured programme gives participants the opportunity to take part in a range of courses with them aim to gain employment and tackle reoffending.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. That this application is <b>NOT</b> supported by the Commissioner.</li> <li>2. That it is noted that the Adullam Programme exceeds the £10,000 project limit and therefore doesn't meet the fund criteria.</li> <li>3. The Adullam Programme should look out for future funding opportunities from the Commissioner e.g. Lancashire Reducing Reoffending Fund.</li> </ol>
