<b>1. NAME:</b>	Elswick Youth Club		
<b>AREA:</b>	Kirkham, Fylde	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Tackling crime & reoffending
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£2,500	<b>Match Funds:</b>	Organisations own resources
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	Elswick Youth Inclusion Project £2,600		
<b>Summary:</b>	Elswick Youth Club will deliver a range of diversionary activities through two targeted sessions per week to young people over a 14 week period. The club will provide a range of activities to target both boys and girls which include football, handball, dance, drama and arts and crafts.		
<b>Comments:</b>	Elswick Youth Club work with the local policing team and the community safety partnership who are both supportive of the Elswick Youth Inclusion Project.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner. 2. That a grant of <b>£2,500</b> is provided to Elswick Youth Club <b>conditional</b> they submit their accounts and constitution and meet the correct criteria.		

<b>2. NAME:</b>	Emues UK – Ridge Community Centre		
<b>AREA:</b>	Lancaster	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Tackling crime & reoffending
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£2,500	<b>Match Funds:</b>	Fundraising
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	Courage 2 Change £2,620		
<b>Summary:</b>	The Courage 2 Change project is an integral part of the Community Alcohol Partnership (CAP) work. Emues UK have already recruited 10 young people as Leaders / Ambassadors who will help deliver the 12 month programme which includes diversionary activities as well as informal youth sessions. The education programme will teach young people about the dangers of alcohol with the aim to help the youngsters make responsible decisions in the future.		
<b>Comments:</b>	Underage drinking is an issue within the Bulk Ward of Lancaster and a Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) was created by the City Council to help tackle the problem. The local community safety partnership are happy to support the Courage 2 Change project.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner. 2. That a grant of <b>£2,500</b> is provided to Emues UK – Ridge Community Centre.		

<b>3. NAME:</b>	Fishwick Rangers Youth Development Scheme		
<b>AREA:</b>	Preston	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Tackling crime & reoffending
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£2,500	<b>Match Funds:</b>	Organisations own resources
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	Community Culture £3,188		
<b>Summary:</b>	Fishwick Rangers will provide a range of diversionary activities to young people but in particular those most vulnerable and at risk of offending. The scheme will also include informal educational sessions through residential and project based work.		
<b>Comments:</b>	Fishwick Rangers work in partnership work with the Friends of Fishwick & St Mathews as well as the local policing team who are able to refer youngsters into the scheme.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner. 2. That a grant of <b>£2,500</b> is provided to Fishwick Rangers Youth Development Scheme.		

<b>4. NAME:</b>	Fylde Walking Football Club		
<b>AREA:</b>	Fylde	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Tackling crime & reoffending
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£2,500	<b>Match Funds:</b>	Organisations own resources
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	'Walk Together' – Inclusion Project £3,000		
<b>Summary:</b>	Fylde Walking Football Club are working with the Cumbria and Lancashire Community Rehabilitation Company (CL-CRC) to deliver a 10 week intervention and engagement programme which specifically works with service users through walking football. The project will aim to cover various topics such as positive behaviour and conduct within the community, mental wellbeing and positive relationships.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner. 2. That a grant of <b>£2,500</b> is provided to Fylde Walking Football Club <b>conditional</b> confirmation is received from the CRC verifying ex-offenders will be referred into the Walk Together Project.

<b>AREA:</b>	Blackburn	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Developing safe and confident communities
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£1,500	<b>Match Funds:</b>	None
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	Many Faiths, One Humanity £1,500		
<b>Details:</b>	The Abu Hanifah Foundation will work with representatives from six faith backgrounds to hold an interfaith event which aims to bring together the residents of Blackburn. The one day event would offer a wide range of activities which explore various religions.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is <b>NOT</b> supported by the Commissioner. 2. That it is noted that the Abu Hanifah Foundation has more than £10k unrestricted reserves and are therefore ineligible for CAF Funding.		

<b>B. NAME:</b>	BDS Training		
<b>AREA:</b>	West Lancashire	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Tackling crime & reoffending
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£2,400	<b>Match Funds:</b>	None
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	BDS Short Courses £2,400		
<b>Details:</b>	BDS is a small training centre which acts as an alternate provision to mainstream schools working with the most disadvantaged, disengaged and isolated young adults with the aim to build confidence whilst increasing employability and life skills.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is <b>NOT</b> supported by the Commissioner. 2. That it is noted that BDS Training is a Limited Company and therefore ineligible for CAF Funding.

<b>AREA:</b>	Burnley	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Supporting vulnerable people and victims
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£2,000	<b>Match Funds:</b>	None
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	Sexual Abuse Support Drop-ins £2,000		
<b>Details:</b>	Brighter Lives North West (BLNW) formed in August 2017 and offer support to victims who are, or have experienced sexual abuse through a drop in service at 6 secure and confidential locations across Burnley & Padiham.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is <b>NOT</b> supported by the Commissioner. 2. That it is noted that Brighter Lives North West CIC have not submitted their accounts/constitution and therefore ineligible for CAF Funding.

<b>AREA:</b>	Lancaster	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Developing safe and confident communities
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£2,000	<b>Match Funds:</b>	Other funding streams (applications pending)
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	Holocaust Day Commemoration Project £5,500		
<b>Details:</b>	More Music wishes to run a series of activities to commemorate the Holocaust. Activities include workshops with young people to develop a performance, a film screening, candle ceremony, dialogue panels in schools and an interfaith service.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is <b>NOT</b> supported by the Commissioner. 2. That it is noted that More Music have more than £10k unrestricted reserves and are therefore ineligible for CAF Funding.

<b>AREA:</b>	West Lancashire	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Does not fully meet the Commissioners priorities
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£2,500	<b>Match Funds:</b>	Fundraising
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	Challenge 2018 £9,370		
<b>Details:</b>	The Tanhouse Morris Dancers are a group of young girls who train and compete in dance competitions around the North West. The group which is run by volunteers would like funding to help cover equipment and costumes for the girls.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is <b>NOT</b> supported by the Commissioner. 2. That it is noted that the application does not fully meet the Commissioner's priorities which are outlined in the Police and Crime Plan.
