<b>AREA:</b>	South Ribble	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Protect Vulnerable People
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£1,584	<b>Match Funds:</b>	Organisations own resources
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	What If? £1,914		
<b>Summary:</b>	Double R Arts wish to run a 12 weeks programme for 10-12 young people aged 11 – 14 years. The project will teach young people the dangers of being 'online'. Young people will take part in workshops, learning about e-safety, from bullying online to Child Sexual Exploitation. After numerous workshops the Young People will create and perform a piece of drama called 'What If' which will explore online safety. The drama will be performed to other youngsters aged 11-14 in youth clubs in the South Ribble area.		
<b>Comments:</b>	Double R Arts are working with Lancashire's Wellbeing, Prevention and Early Help service (the Young People's service) to target Young People within South Ribble.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner 2. That a grant of <b>£1,584</b> is provided to Double R Arts for the "What If?" Project.		

<b>2. NAME:</b>	Nelson Football Club		
<b>AREA:</b>	Pendle	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Tackle Crime, ASB & Re-offending
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£2,000	<b>Match Funds:</b>	None
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	Nelson FC in the Community £2,214		
<b>Summary:</b>	Nelson Football Club will deliver an 18 weeks stimulating multi-sports programme for Young People aged 12-18 years. The project will allow youngsters to participate in Football, Dodgeball, Handball and Cricket which will be delivered in 3 venues across the district for weekly 2 hour sessions.		
<b>Comments:</b>	Nelson has seen a concerning rise in youth related ASB and Nelson Football Club are working with the Local Neighbourhood Policing team to target certain Young People.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner 2. That a grant of <b>£2,000</b> is provided to Nelson Football Club for their multi-sports project.		

<b>3. NAME:</b>	Piggy Park Community Garden Association		
<b>AREA:</b>	Hyndburn	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Tackle Crime, ASB and Re-offending
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£2,500	<b>Match Funds:</b>	Hyndburn Borough Council
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	Piggy Park Community Garden Security Fencing £9,822.43		
<b>Summary:</b>	Piggy Park Community Garden Association wish to install a security fence across the front of the site to enclose it, to allow controlled access. A number of community groups from Rishton will use the site for regular organised activities.		
<b>Comments:</b>	PPCGA are experiencing a high number of alcohol related ASB on site which is delaying the re-development of the site.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner 2. That a grant of <b>£2,100</b> is provided to the Piggy Park Community Garden Association to fund half of the Security Fencing.		

<b>4. NAME:</b>	Skelmersdale Action For Youth (S.A.Y)		
<b>AREA:</b>	West Lancashire	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Tackle Crime, ASB and Re-offending
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£2,500	<b>Match Funds:</b>	Organisations own resources
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	Get Involved in Early Action Activities £2,500		
<b>Summary:</b>	S.A.Y would like to run a number of diversionary positive activities which will engage a number of Young People across the town. Activities will include Crazy Carts and Solo Wheel's which will be open to Young People aged 7-18 years.		
<b>Comments:</b>	S.A.Y will run its activities from the community centres in Digmoo, Tanhouse and Birchgreen, all these areas suffer from high levels of ASB.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner 2. That a grant of <b>£2,500</b> is provided to S.A.Y for their Get Involved in Early Action Activities.		

<b>5. NAME:</b>	Tanterton Village Centre Limited		
<b>AREA:</b>	Preston	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Tackle Crime, ASB & Re-offending and Protect Vulnerable People
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£1,312	<b>Match Funds:</b>	Local County Councillor
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	CCTV £1,512		
<b>Summary:</b>	Tanterton Village Centre wish to upgrade their CCTV System. The centre currently holds many community activities, for example a Youth Club, Baby and Toddler Group and an Over 55's friendship group. In the future the centre wishes to act as a 'drop in' centre for the local residents.		
<b>Comments:</b>	The centre is located in an area with high levels of ASB and with a new CCTV system, the centre will aid the police with identification of offenders, as the CCTV will not only look over the centre but the local shops as well.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner 2. That a grant of <b>£1,312</b> is provided towards the upgrade of Tanterton Village Centres CCTV.

<b>AREA:</b>	Fylde	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Protect Vulnerable People & Champion the rights of Victims
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£2,500	<b>Match Funds:</b>	Organisations own resources
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	M.A.P.S (Male Abuse Peer Support) ongoing		
<b>Summary:</b>	M.A.P.S is a specialist group who offer support to men who are victims of any form of abuse. Support includes, peer groups, 121 support service, counselling, assessments and a buddy service so the male has someone to contact and talk to in between meetings.		
<b>Comments:</b>	Three Leaves receive referrals from many organisations and also wish to develop and implement an awareness raising campaign for men.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner 2. That a grant of <b>£2,500</b> is provided towards the ongoing costs of the Male Abuse Peer Support Group.

<b>AREA:</b>	Fylde	<b>PRIORITY:</b>	Protect Vulnerable People & Tackle Crime, ASB and Re-offending
<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£2,400	<b>Match Funds:</b>	Organisations own resources
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	Fylde Walking Football Club £2,700		
<b>Summary:</b>	Fylde Football Together will run walking football sessions to vulnerable adults within Fylde on a Thursday evening for 40 weeks.		
<b>Comments:</b>	Fylde Football Together work closely with AFC Fylde and agreed to allow 4 offenders from AFC Fylde's rehabilitation programme to attend the football sessions to help integrate them with the community.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner 2. That a grant of <b>£2,400</b> is provided to Fylde Football Together <b>conditional</b> they have the correct safeguarding measures in place whilst mixing both ex-offenders and vulnerable people together.
