### Executive Summary

The Commissioner allocated £30,000 to support the work of street pastors, street angels and similar organisations from the Community Safety and Partnership Fund.

The Commissioner launched a grant opportunity for street pastors, street angels and similar organisations that was published on the Commissioner's website with a deadline for applications to be submitted by Monday 14<sup>th</sup> December 2020.

This Decision seeks to confirm the allocation of £45,490 from The Street Pastors, Street Angels and similar organisations fund to the five organisations outlined in Appendix A.

The additional £15,490 will be met from the Community Safety Fund.

### Recommendations

The Commissioner is recommended to approve the proposed use of the Community Safety and Partnership Fund as follows:

1. Blackpool & the Fylde Street Angels - £13,500
2. Chorley Street Pastors - £5,000
3. Ormskirk Street Pastors - £3,000
4. Preston and South Ribble Street Pastors - £12,000
5. IMO - £11,990

as outlined in Appendix A.


