Executive Summary

The Commissioner has provided funding for the provision of grants to enable activity that supports the delivery of his Police and Crime Plan.

The 'Safer Lancashire Neighbourhoods Fund' includes the 'Community Fund' which provides grants of up to £10,000 to deliver activity that will address one or more of the Police and Crime Plan priorities:

- Getting tough on Anti-social behaviour
- Disrupting and dismantling organised crime
- Tackling domestic abuse and sexual violence
- Cracking down on burglary and robbery
- Targeting dangerous drivers

The Police and Crime Commissioner received 19_applications to the Fund in July/August 2022.

This report sets out the proposed treatment of these 19 applications for funding
