AMOUNT REQUESTED:	£8,000	MATCH FUNDS:	£236 of their own fund will be used.
SUMMARY:	Blackpool Musical School aim to provide young people with a safe and structured place to go to mix with likeminded people and channel aggression and frustration through music. They wish to offer a variety of music lessons to attract the young people to engage, offer peer support and an opportunity to gain formal recognition through certification. Blackpool Musical School will work with Blackpool Council's Youth Involvement Team and the local Police to identify and target young people at risk or involved in ASB and crime.

This overall aim of the project is to deter burglaries.

This will include sessions provided by the JJ Effect.</p> <p>It is hoped that young people will engage with the Youth Outreach Workers and build relationships that encourage young people to continue attending sessions after the weeklong programme.</p>
