SUMMARY:	<p>Pennine Oak's wish to undertake an innovative way to target young people and divert their behaviour into a more proactive activity. Outdoor Adventure and Diversion involves working with young people (30 per session) aged 11 through 18 who have been highlighted as needing intervention and are involved in anti-social behaviour.</p> <p>Preference will be given to referrals from social services and the police. The idea is for the young people to have a safe space to attend and experience a range of different activities to divert them from ASB and crime. Fishing will be the main activity used; this was taken from the pilot project as it has a calming therapeutic effect on the children/YP. Other activities consist of but are not limited to diversionary activities, tree planting, nature grow and sow, dry-stone walling, and archery.</p>

SUMMARY:	<p>Clayton Amateur Boxing and Community Club will provide a coaching module to targeted young people which will introduce them to the sport, and fitness principles such as circuit training and aerobics over a 1 year period.</p> <p>Approximately 32 new and unique individuals will be engaged with and participate in a boxing-based training and discipline programme. Clayton Amateur Boxing and Community Club work with local services including the police, Active Lancashire, and the Community Alcohol Partnership to target young people at risk.</p>

SUMMARY:	<p>The aim of the project is to address ASB within specified problem locations and implement positive pathways for young people. This will be a partnership approach to crime and reoffending to develop a safe and confident community. This project will make positive links with officers delivering the Divert programme which looks at reducing reoffending and helps young people to make positive life changes. The project will look to deliver two key themed engagement sessions, one focusing on young people aged 12-17 and will deliver multi-sports activities. Each young person will have the opportunity to access local youth clubs, exercise programmes and music projects. The second engagement session will be working with young people between 18–24 an age group tends to have the hardest to reach youths within communities including ex-offenders, youths at risk of addiction, youths taking part in risk taking behaviours and those not in employment or further education. This strand will focus on employability and training along with activities.</p>

SUMMARY:	<p>Burnley Youth Theatre want to address ASB in schools and the local community through education. A trained drama practitioner will lead workshops with input from the school and local police focusing on ASB and the consequences.</p> <p>A group of 20 young people will create an educational film and resource pack focussing on ASB.</p> <p>Phase two, once the film is created, will be launched to all pupils aged 11-16 at Blessed Trinity RC College where each class will view the product alongside a workshop.</p>
