Executive Summary The Commissioner has provided funding for the provision of grants to enable activity that supports the delivery of his Police and Crime Plan. The Summer Community Fund provides grants of up to £3,000 to deliver activity that will address one or more of the Police and Crime Plan priorities: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Prevent Violence Against Women and Girls• Tackle Crime and Anti-Social Behaviour• Get Tough on Serious Violent Crime• Rebuild Trust and Confidence in Policing The Police and Crime Commissioner received 98 applications in June 2025, of which 85 met published eligibility criteria.	
Recommendation The Police and Crime Commissioner is recommended to approve the allocation of £130,253 to support 46 projects.	

PART I

1. Background and Advice

The Summer Community Fund was open between 2nd May and 26th May 2025. The OPCC received 96 applications of which 9 were ineligible in line with the fund guidelines. The funding round was aimed at supporting short-term, diversionary projects during the school summer holidays.

The eligible applications were shared with partners from Problem Oriented Policing Team, Local Community Safety Managers, Lancashire County Council Youth Justice Service, and internal policy leads in the OPCC for feedback and scoring.

Based on the feedback and scoring from partners the PCC is recommended to support 46 applications – detailed at Appendix A, with a total value of £130,253.
