Executive Summary The proposal seeks £9,900 in funding to extend a successful youth diversion programme at West View Leisure Centre in Preston until January 2026. The initiative targets vulnerable young males (ages 11–16) in areas affected by serious youth violence, organised crime, and deprivation, particularly within the Clear, Hold, Build zones of St Matts and Fishwick Wards.	
Recommendation The Commissioner is asked to approve the allocation of £9,900 to Preston United for the expansion of West View diversionary activities.	

PART I

1. Background and Advice

The programme was initially funded through the Police Prevention and Problem-Solving Innovation Fund (PPIF) and demonstrated strong engagement, with up to 75 attendees per session and 95% retention. It aligns with the Police and Crime Plan 2024–29, supporting objectives under “Tackling Crime and ASB” and “Getting Tough on Serious Violence.” The pilot revealed high levels of weapon carrying among youth and a lack of positive role models, highlighting the urgent need for sustained intervention.

The 15-week extension will provide weekly evening sessions involving sports, mentoring, and meals, delivered by youth workers, police officers, and coaches. The programme aims to reduce exploitation by organised crime groups (OCGs), foster community cohesion, and prepare participants for transition into The Vault Youth Zone, a long-term youth provision partner.
