<p>Executive Summary</p> <p>The Commissioner has provided funding for the provision of grants to enable activity that supports the delivery of his Police and Crime Plan.</p> <p>The Member of Parliament Fund provides grants of up to £50,000 to deliver activity that will address one or more of the Police and Crime Plan priorities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Prevent Violence Against Women and Girls • Tackle Crime and Anti-Social Behaviour • Get Tough on Serious Violent Crime • Rebuild Trust and Confidence in Policing <p>This activity must also address one or more of the local area's strategic priorities.</p> <p>The Police and Crime Commissioner received an application from Burnley's MP.</p>	
<p>Recommendation</p> <p>The Police and Crime Commissioner is asked to approve the allocation of £5,500 to Burnley MP's sponsored project with Padiham on Parade to deliver the Padiham on Parade 2026 project.</p>	

PART I

1. Background and Advice

The PCC recently launched a dedicated funding round to allow each of Lancashire's 16 MPs the opportunity to apply for funding to support community safety initiatives within their constituencies. They can propose schemes for consideration by the Commissioner through the application process, with a total funding cap of £50,000 per MP.

Oliver Ryan, MP for Burnley has submitted an application in support of the *Padiham on Parade 2026 project* led by Padiham on Parade. Padiham on Parade is a multi-day community event designed to foster respect and understanding between generations, reduce anti-social behaviour, and promote positive engagement through collaboration with uniformed services and local partners.

The application requests **£5,500** as a grant contribution to educational activities, interactive sessions and police-led community engagement to help support community cohesion. The total project cost is **£25,000**.
